Appendix B - Strategic Planning Report, Cllr Parkinson

Alfriston Parish Council

Strategic Planning Portfolio: Monthly Update June 2025. Neil Parkinson.

Emergency Response Plan

- I received few comments on the public draft of the emergency response plan for the village, but they were all positive. We are now operationalising the plan.
 - The Emergency Committee plans to meet in June to finalise the main plan, the key risks, and ensure that everyone is aware of the main details. The plan will then be available on the APC website and circulated to key stakeholders.
 - I have drafted a very condensed version of the key points to circulate as a leaflet to village households and businesses.
 - Cllr Spring has kindly offered to provide a new emergency phone number for APC and the
 emergency committee free of charge via his company. This number, 01323 692455, is only
 for use in an extreme emergency, for example when life is threatened, there is a need for
 an evacuation, or when emergency services cannot be contacted or reach the village.
 Cllrs will be asked to ratify approval of this provision at the June meeting; we also need to
 configure the number.
 - I have created a confidential operational document listing building access arrangements, village resources, and people who asked to be put on a priority assistance list. This has been circulated to Cllrs.
 - o I have obtained and installed a secure keybox in the village for APC emergency use.
- As previously, APC continues to request 1) help from those with relevant resources, and 2) anyone especially vulnerable in an emergency to let us know if they wish to go on a priority list which may be shared with emergency services.

Offers of village resources – for accommodation, coordination, or practical support (eg hardware or specialist skills) would be very welcome. Please contact the Clerk if you are an individual or a business who can help.

Appendix C - Report for The Tye, by Cllr Jonathan Spring.

1. Sunken Road Repair

Have received a quote from Hailsham Roadways to repair the sunken area on the Tye Road. The total cost is £4508 plus vat.

It is likely this is the full cost but once the ground is opened up, there may be other works required if it's being caused by other than poor repair last time, when it was back filled after a drain installation many years ago. Therefore we require a contingency sum of £2000 plus vat.

As we have little money in the Tye budget can I ask that we find it from another budget to facilitate a speedy repair.

The most obvious one to me is the Highways allocation as the council has not had to pay for as much as expected on the road scheme.

As the council has limited reserves, if we cannot find a grant, I see the only other would be to wait until April which I really feel would be inappropriate as it needs repair now.

2. Leak on Tye

Finally this was repaired by much chasing and pressure on Southern Water. I spent quite a lot of time hanging on the phone and waiting for call backs. Thanks to all those who helped chase them too, especially Martin and Gayle. The collective pressure does work.

3. Sustainable Outdoor Pursuit Event.

As I am writing this in time for the agenda to go out, unfortunately I have not received some update information in time to go out in advance.
